Primary Advantage Governing Body Targets

In April, our Governing body reviewed and evaluated the targets they set at the beginning of the academic year. On our website you will find our impact statement outlining how we have achieved our targets.

Our new targets identified for the next school next year are:

- 1. To improve attendance so that all schools are at least in the top 50% with all schools working towards being in the top 30% of schools nationally.
- 2. To secure attainment to continue to be at least in line with national expectations or above with a continued focus on the attainment and progress of more able pupils.
- 3. To continue the focus on Governance to secure the direction of travel for PAF schools.

We will review our new targets throughout the year.

Primary Advantage Consultation with Gainsborough De Beauvoir Primary School

In the Autumn term Primary Advantage ran a consultation to propose an expansion to include Gainsborough and De Beauvoir Primary Schools.

The consultation for the Federation of Primary Advantage Federation with Gainsborough and De Beauvoir Schools took place between 7th September and 19th October 2016. Paper copies and a link to an online form of the consultation document were made available for parents and staff of all the schools, and the Diocese of London were sent a copy.

Feedback

Overall, the significant majority of respondents agreed with the proposal to federate Gainsborough and De Beauvoir Schools with the Primary Advantage Federation. 72% of respondents agreed with the proposal, with 3% disagreeing.

There were a number of positive comments which highlighted the benefits that joining the Federation would bring to De Beauvoir and Gainsborough schools.

The responses were also very clear that staff and parents feel that the Primary Advantage Federation would experience a mutual benefit from the arrangement.

In November, the Full Governing Body of Primary Advantage, as well the Governing bodies for Gainsborough and De Beauvoir held a meeting to decide whether the expansion should go ahead. A unanimous decision was made that Gainsborough and De Beauvoir will join Primary Advantage.

We are very excited to welcome Gainsborough and De Beauvoir to Primary Advantage! They will officially join us in April 2017. Stay tuned!


Official Opening
